E-waste

For the past few years, Jakarta has stepped up its efforts to process electronic waste or e-waste.

Last year alone, from January to October, the city's Environmental Office managed to collect 22.683 kilograms of used electronic appliances such as phones, ACs, TVs, washing machines, computers and many others.

E-waste is electrical and electronic goods or equipment that are obsolete, have ended their life cycle, and no longer provide value or benefit to their owners. E-waste contains hazardous and toxic materials (B3).

Jakartans who wish to dispose their e-waste can drop them off in a dropbox provided at Transjakarta shelters and train and MRT stations.
