Mudik

Earlier this month, the government announced that it will not strictly forbid people for going back to their hometowns for the Idul Fitri holidays.

The annual tradition of *mudik* (exodus) has been rather limited the past two years due to the pandemic, but as situation improves, travel requirements have now been eased.

Those who have received a booster vaccine are not required to present a negative Covid-19 test before departing, double-jabbed will need to take an antigen while single-jabbed must undergo a PCR test no more than three days before the trip.

This particular policy has led to a doubled number of daily booster dose and is expected to contribute in achieving 30% boosted coverage by the end of May.

Travelers who are medically ineligible for vaccination must present a letter issued by a doctor at a state hospital in addition to a negative PCR test result. Children under 6 years old are exempt from the vaccination requirement, but must be accompanied by a fully vaccinated adult.
