Happy Easter!

This weekend, Christians around the world will celebrate Easter.

Despite its significance as a Christian holy day where Jesus resurrects from death, many of the traditions and symbols actually have roots in pagan celebrations—particularly the pagan goddess Eostre—and in the Jewish holiday of Passover.
